WORKSHOP 1 AGENDA

COMPLETION OF RECREATION FUND BUDGET

Board discussion centered on the need for repairs to pavilion #2 at Silver Mine Park. Vice-Chairman Haas reported that the use of a dump trailer pulled by tractor instead of a truck will save money at Silver Mine Park. Supervisor Lehman again pointed out that this Fund is not self-supporting with costs exceeding income and will be increasingly relying on financial support from the General Fund in future years. Total amount of the Recreation Fund budget for 2026 is \$72,591.92

COMPLETION OF STATE HIGHWAY FUND BUDGET

Board discussion centered mainly on the lower amount of liquid fuels revenue from the State with revenue again lower than 2025. Vice-Chairman Haas presented clarification of and rationale for the road projects for 2026. He led a discussion on the pros and cons of repaving versus tar and chip on Sprecher and Millwood

Roads. The budgeted amount for the State Highway fund for 2026 is \$272,790.38.

COMPLETION OF GENERAL FUND BUDGET

Board discussion centered on:

- (1) current status and future police car needs
- (2) earned income tax increased revenue
- (3) lower income from Comcast
- (4) cost increases for health insurance and workman's comp
- (5) the removal timetable for the Radcliff Road bridge
- (6) the need for a part-time employee to scan township documents
- (7) the need for a new roof for the Township Building
- (8) condition of township's road equipment
- (9) the cost of a new township website
- (10) the 17.5% increased cost for police and road crew health insurance, increases in other insurances for the township

The budgeted amount for the 2026 General Fund is \$3,085,508.82.

Summation:

After discussion on the budget's deficit, the Board agreed to transfer \$90,545 from the Capital Reserve Fund and reluctantly raise taxes by 8% (1.777) mils to balance the 2026 budget. The tax increase will raise revenue by approximately \$63,689.54 creating a balanced budget.

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VOTING:

Chairman Lehman moved to forward the 2026 Recreation Fund proposed budget to the Budget Hearing to be held at 7:00 pm on December 3, 2025 at the Pequea Township Municipal Building. Vice-Chairman Haas seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

Chairman Lehman moved to forward the 2026 State Highway Fund Proposed Budget to the Budget Hearing at 7:00 pm on December 3, 2025 at the Pequea Township Municipal Building. Supervisor Kreider seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

Chairman Lehman moved to forward the 2025 General Fund proposed budget to the Budget Hearing to be held at 7:00 pm on December 3, 2025. Supervisor Lucas seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

Chairman Lehman moved to set the proposed tax millage for 2026 at 1.777 mils for the Budget Hearing at 7:00 pm on December 3, 2025. Supervisor Lucas seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

OTHER BUSINESS:

PUBLIC COMMENTS: none

1. Consider Approval for WAWA Sewage Facilities Planning Module via Resolution #749-2025

Chairman Lehman moved to pass **Resolution #749-2025.** Supervisor Kreider seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

2. Authorize the Agreement for Chief John Michener

Chairman Lehman moved to authorize Chief John Michener's employment agreement subject to approval and signature of the police contract and police stations lease extension. Supervisor Lucas seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

3. Authorize the Contract for the Pequea Township Police Officers

Chairman Lehman moved to authorize the Pequea Township officers' contract subject to signature of Chief Michener's agreement and police station lease extension. Supervisor Kreider seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

4. Authorize the Agreement for New Danville Fire Company Lease Extension to 2030

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Chairman Lehman moved to extend the police station lease through 2030 @ an annual increase of 3% subject to the signing of Chief Michener and Police contracts. Vice-Chairman Haas seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

5. Consider Request for Financial Security Release #4.1 for Penn Grant Commons West Phase 1 (Land Development/Storm Water Plan)

Chairman Lehman moved that the Township reduce the letter of credit currently held by Pequea Township in the amount of \$245,055.27. Supervisor Lucas seconded the motion. All voted in favor. This was a reduction of \$245,055.27 leaving a balance of \$0.00.

6. Consider Request for Financial Security Release #3 for Penn Grant Commons West Phase 2

Chairman Lehman moved to reduce the letter of credit currently held by Pequea Township in the amount \$405,417.47. Supervisor Lucas seconded the motion. All voted in favor. This was a reduction of \$405,417.47 leaving a balance of \$347,704.69.

7. Discuss Hiring of Part-Time Police Officer

This item was tabled indefinitely.

8. Set Roadmaster Wages

Vice-Chairman Haas moved to set Brandon Suter's wages at \$30 per hour effective 11/3/2025 and at \$32 per hour after a successful 90-day evaluation. Chairman Lehman seconded the motion. All voted in favor.

*Note-the second and third budget workshops, conditionally scheduled, are now canceled as all necessary budget work has been completed.
